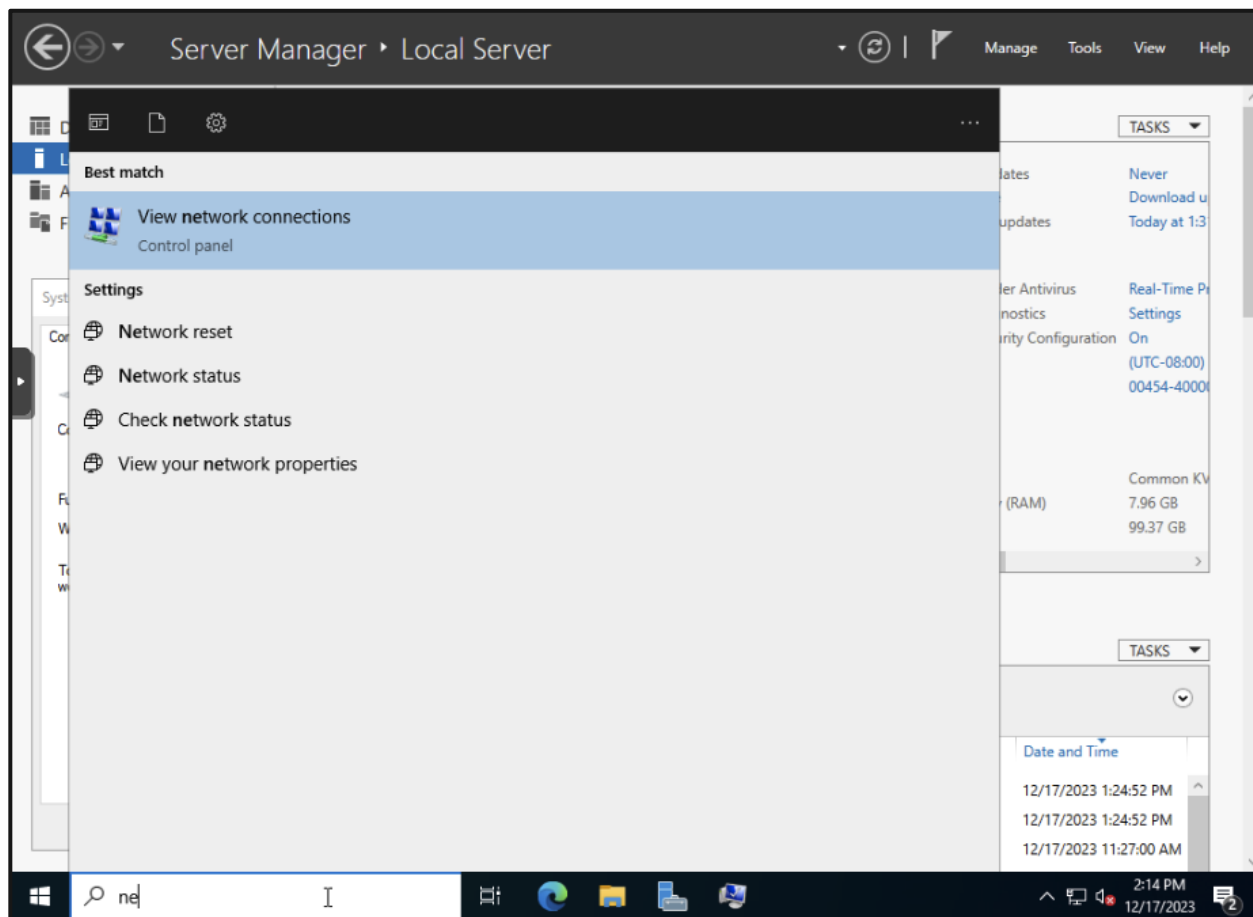

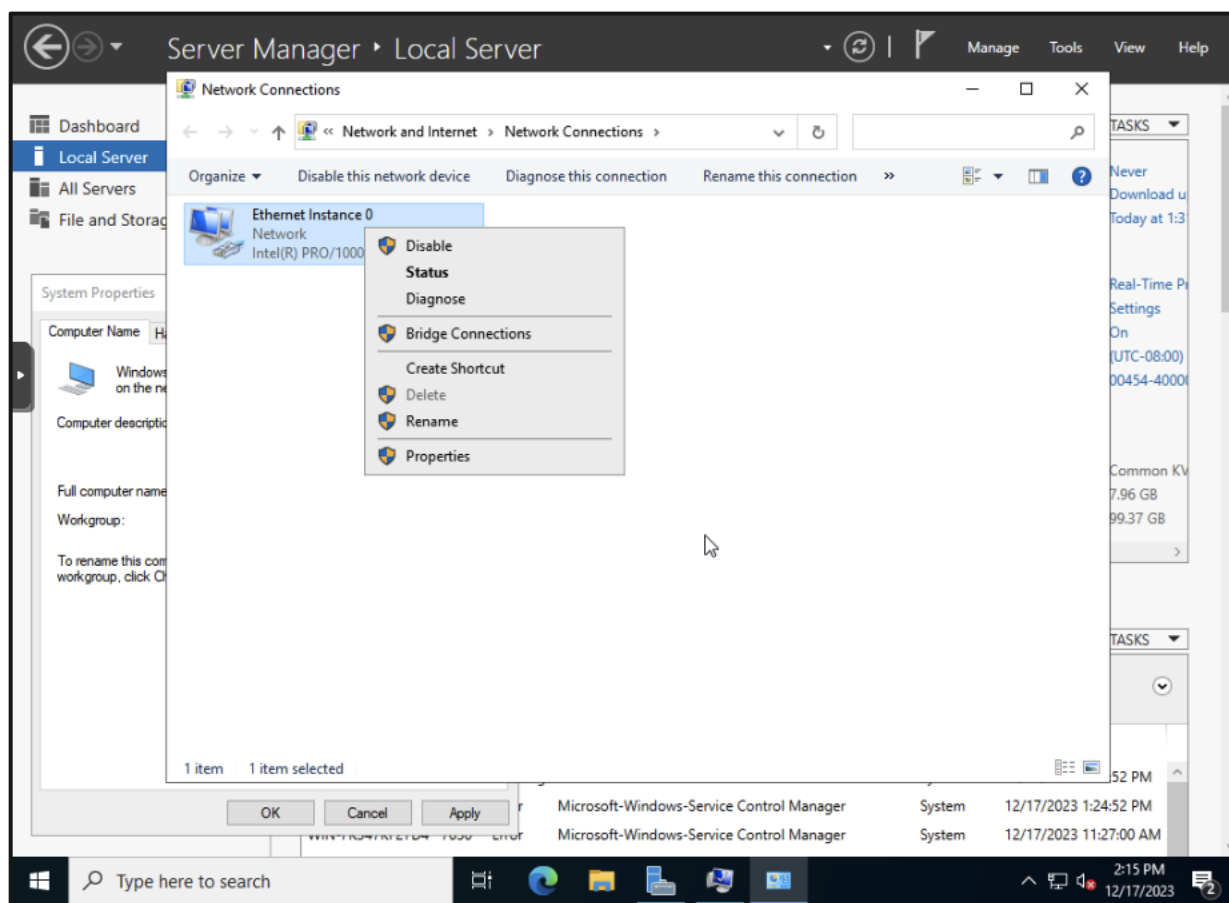

How to join Active Directory Domain Services

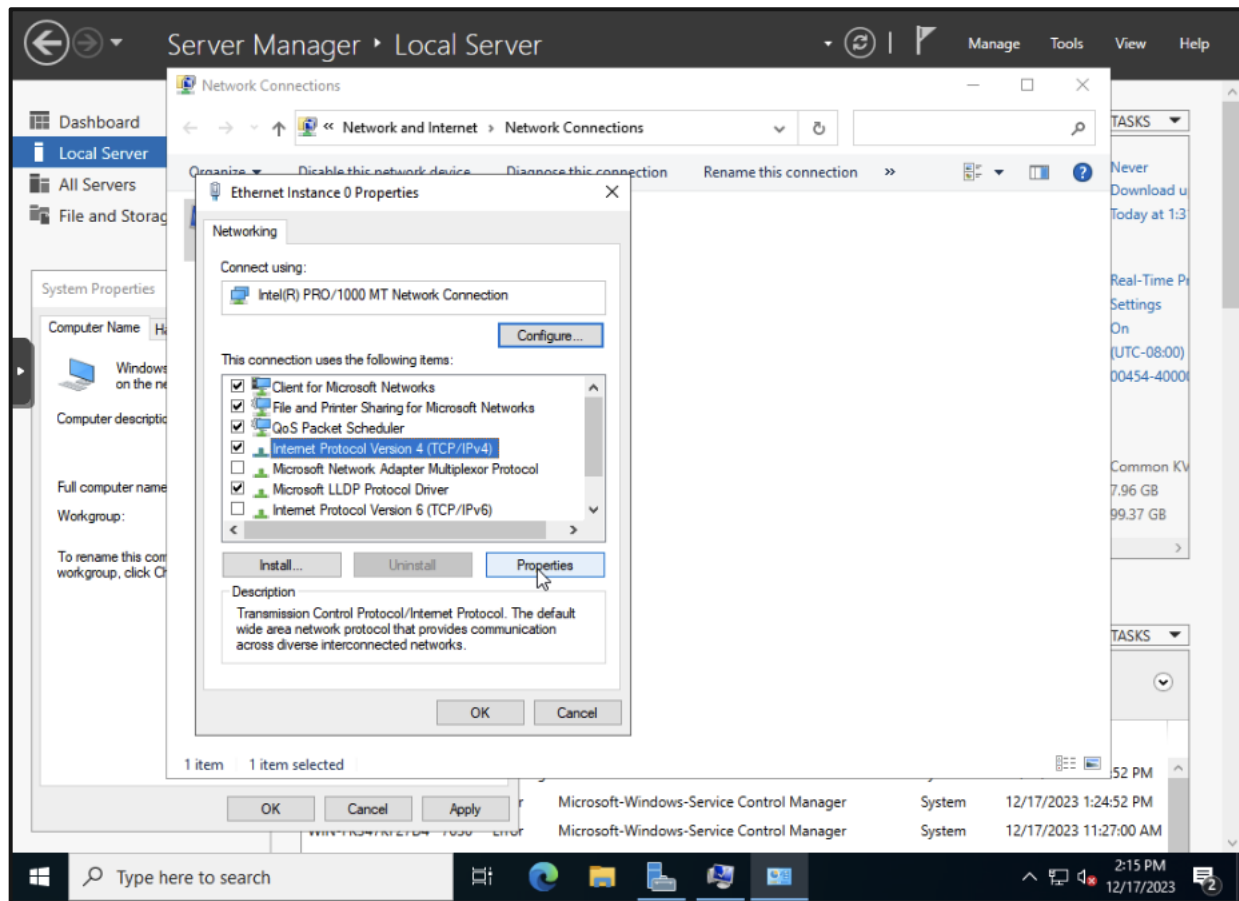
To join Active Directory Domain Services (ADDS) we'll begin by need to modify our network interface to communicate with a Domain Controller. To do this, navigate to Network Connections.



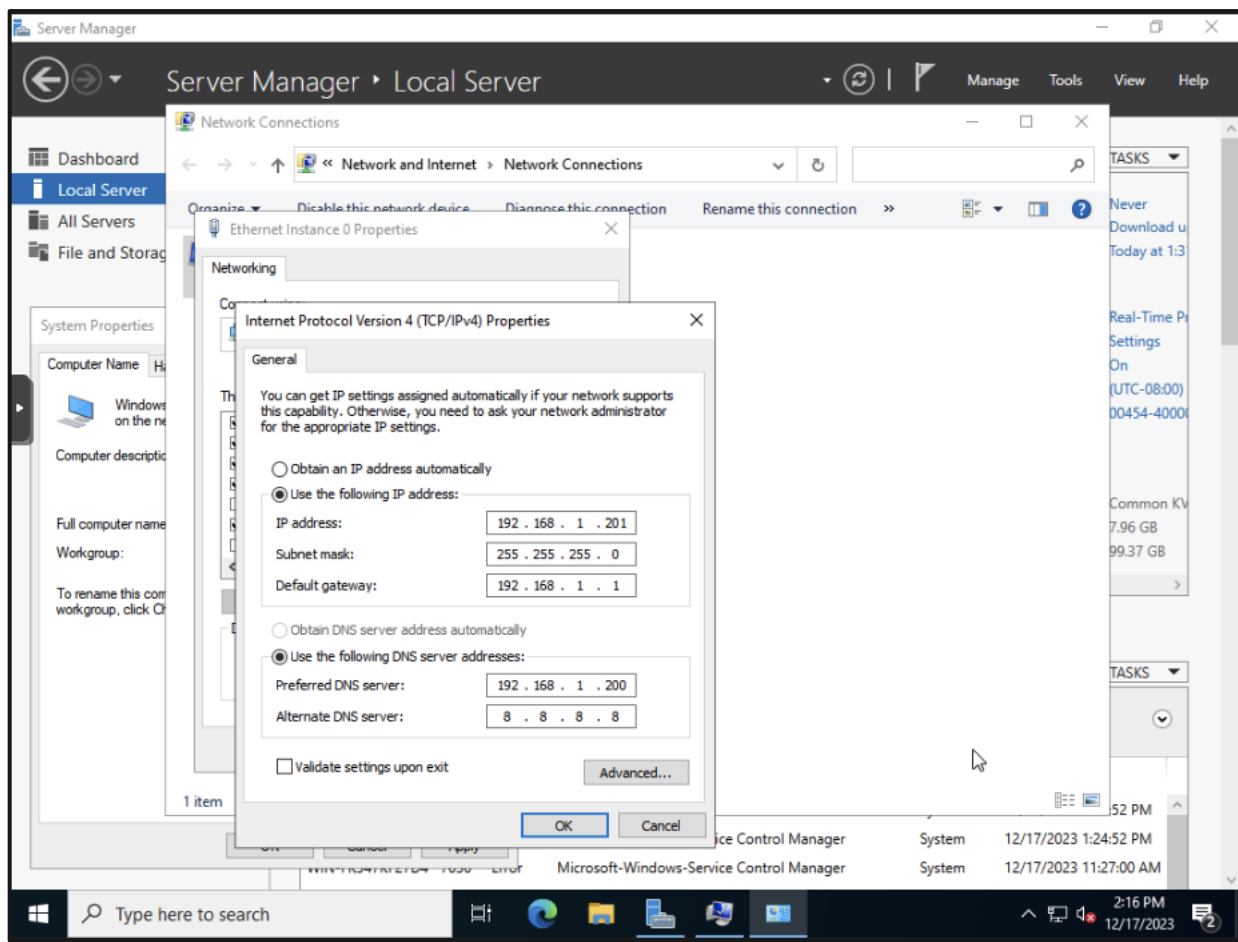
With Network Connections, right click the desired interface and select properties.



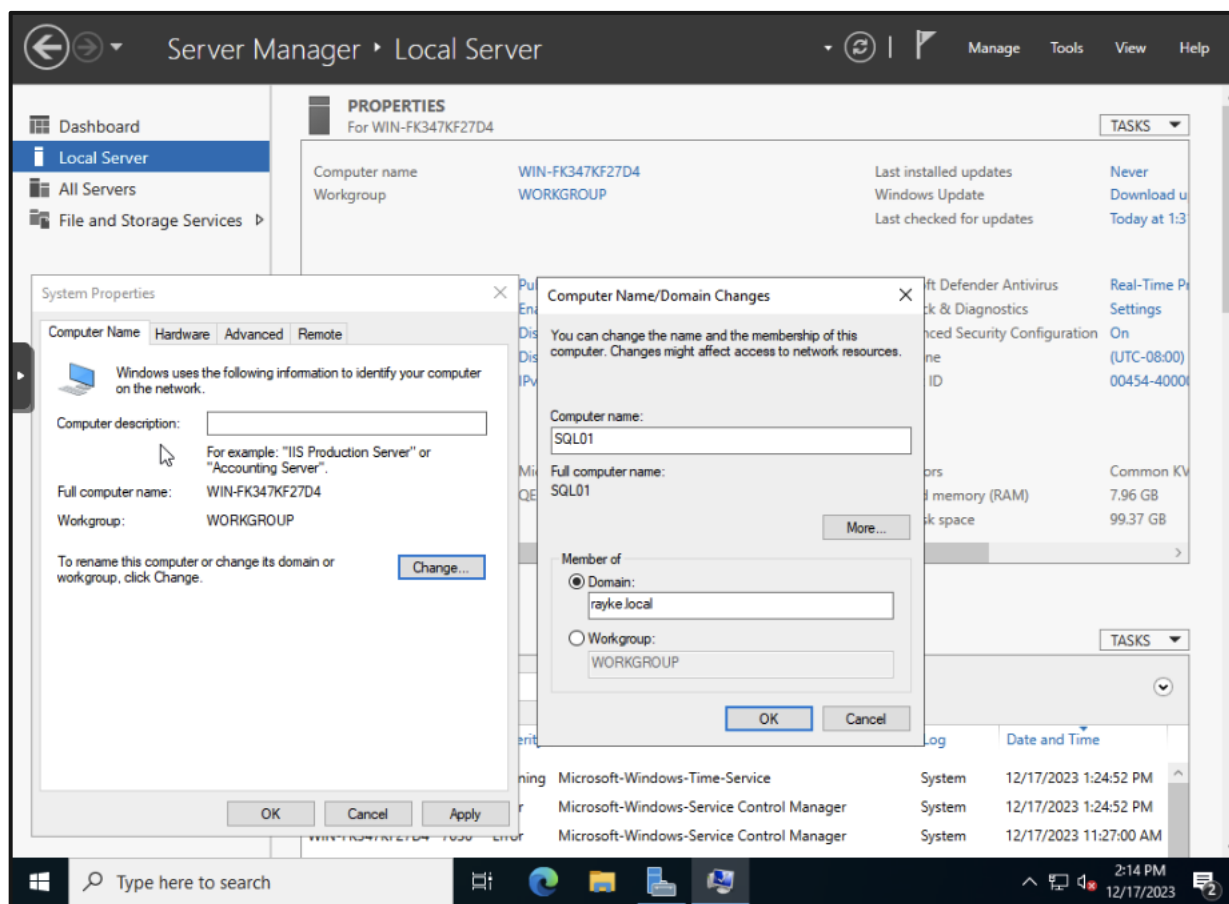
For the selected interface, we'll optionally disable IPv6 and select properties for IPv4.



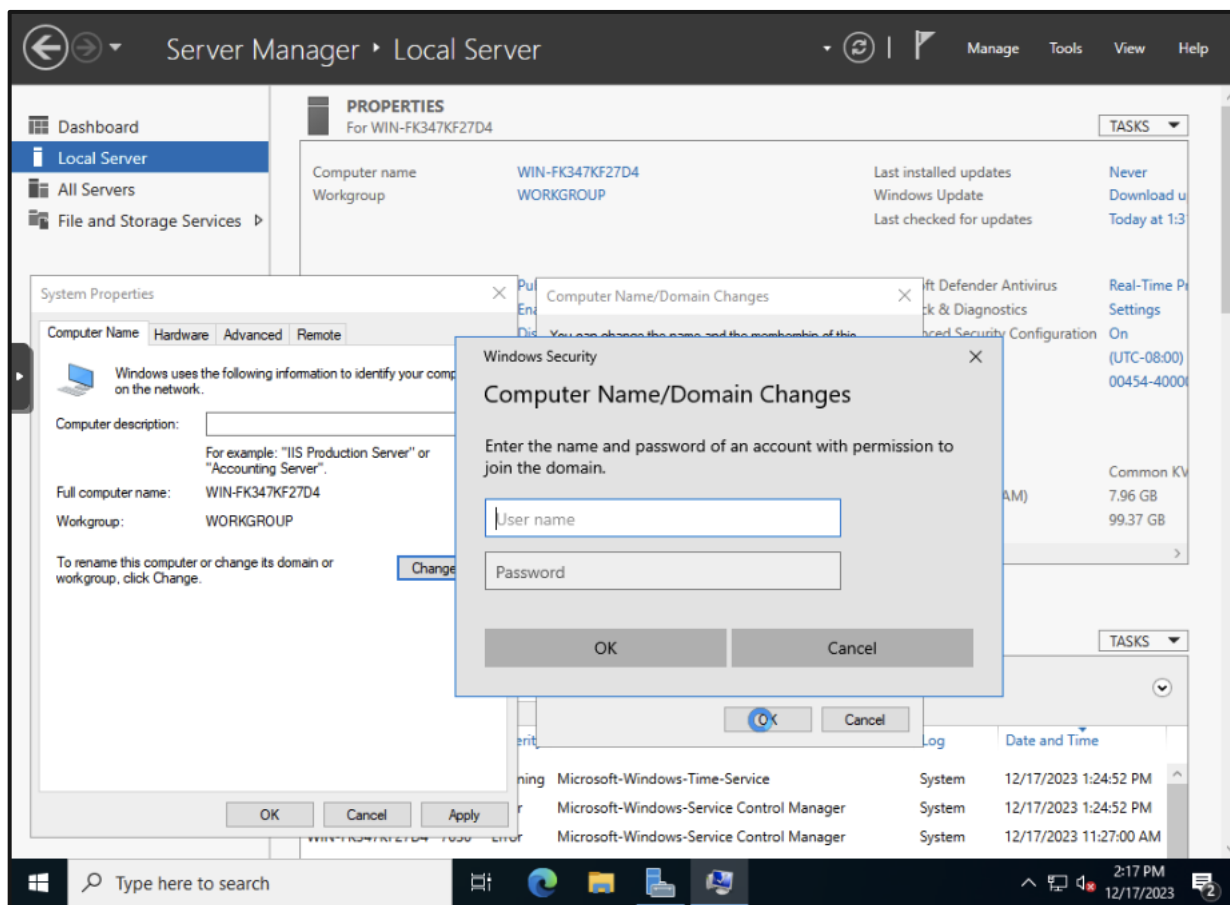
The Preferred DNS Server will be a Domain Controller and the IP address will optionally be either automatic or static.



With our network interface properly configured, navigate to Computer Name/Domain Changes. Within this dialog optionally set a new Computer name and select Domain for Member of.



Upon completion, we'll be prompted for domain authentication.



With successful authentication we'll be joined to the rayke.local domain.
